## SEPT BREAKFAST CLUB TO CARLSILE By Rick Daes

Saturday September 9th was a pleasant morning with low humidity and as always departed from Christ the King Church at 8:15. We drove across the river bridge on I-430 and had a great view of the Big Dam Bridge being constructed across the Arkansas River. We turned East on I-40 and continued on at a safe speed as to not to attract the attention from the many law enforcement agencies that were out in force.

We headed South on I-440 and immediately got on Hwy. 70 headed East. The sun had already risen and in the first 5 miles or so the limbs of the cypress trees hung above the highway giving us plenty of shade as we drove past Galloway. There at the intersection of Hwy. 391 and Hwy. 70 sat Ray Gage waiting to join our caravan. Once we left Pulaski County and entered Lonoke County the road is a straight away for almost 15 miles, a great stretch of highway to open it up, which we did on our return trip. One must be mindful of large and small farm equipment entering and exiting from what seems to be out of nowhere. We went through Lonoke very slowly and then on over to Carlisle to Advada's, just turn right on to Francis Street located beside the Elder Building and go two blocks and turn left into a gravel parking lot. Leon Ward greeted outside and suggested we pull our cars in the grassy area up closer to the restaurant. Leon told us he and a friend owned a Porsche and would we like to see it so we decided to take a tour of a couple of reconditioned sheds there on the property. The first shed had a restored 1965 Falcon Sprint with a 289 in it, very nicely done and a 2003 Mustang Cobra SVT with a 6 speed, 390 hp. Cobra engine. The second shed had a 1991 BMW V-12 automatic with retractable head lights and a Black 1996 Carrera 4 Cab.

Then we entered the restaurant and what a unique place then was, it was very clean, with sheet metal for the ceiling and walls and very nicely decorated with old photo's, framed pictures, model cars, tractors and farm equipment. They even had an advertisement for my Ford 8-N tractor hanging on the wall, I felt right at home. They offer a variety of menu items for breakfast and lunch. Leon and Advada Ward are the owner operators and are very friendly, down home folks. Once breakfast was over we not only left a tip for our waitress but I even left one for Leon, an application to join the Ozark Region Porsche Club. Carlisle is about a 45 minute drive from Little Rock and Advada's is a restaurant we will put on our list to go back to.
